- 4. Eagles are High Flyers...10,000 feet
- 5. Eagles Never Eat Dead Meat "People you hang around with and the books you read eventually determine the person you become"
- 6. Eagles Possess Vitality (30 years old)...pick their feathers, pull out their own talons....to start new growth. Eagles retire until new feathers and talons grow.
- 7. Eagles Nurture their younger ones...they know how to feed, lead, weed, and lead. They get that over time.
