"Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God my open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity." Colossians 4:2-5

Paul first encourages us to be consistent in prayer.

When he says, "devote your self to prayer," the word devote means "to persist at."

It means, "to remain at something" or "to cling to something" or "to continually be available for something."

Reasons for Lifting the Hands in Praise:

1. Lifting the Hands is a Scriptural way of expressing Thanks to God!

Psalm 63:3-4, "Your unfailing love is better than life itself; how I praise you! ⁴ I will praise you as long as I live, lifting up my hands to you in prayer."

2. Lifting The Hands is an appropriate way to Worship God in the Sanctuary.

Psalm 132:4, "Lift your hands toward the sanctuary, and praise the LORD."

3. It is God's Will that We Worship in this Way.

1 Timothy 2:8, "In every place of worship, I want men to pray with holy hands lifted up to God, free from anger and controversy."

4. Lifting Hands is a Symbolic way of expressing Ascending Worship.

Psalm 141:2, "Accept my prayer as incense offered to you, and my upraised hands as an evening offering."

5. Lifting the hands is a way of expressing Spiritual Thirsting. Psalm 143:6, "I lift my hands to you in prayer. I thirst for you as parched land thirsts for rain."
