Solomon Writes Many Proverbs

1 Kings 4:29-34; Proverbs 1:1-7

The Lord granted to Solomon...great wisdom. Why? Note all the traits and gifts God gave to Solomon:

- Wisdom
- Great Insight
- A great portion of understanding

Solomon used what God gave him:

- He spoke; He wrote; He taught; He described details of God's creation.
- If you gained great wisdom, how do you think you would use it?

Is there anything that you would like to see accomplished that you don't feel you can at this time in your life....or, because of your lack of ability, you cannot accomplish this one thing...but would still like to?




Summary of Today's Lesson

Solomon's Dealings with God



- The people of Israel were not the only ones who were amazed by Solomon's wisdom (people in surrounding countries were awed by Solomon's astounding wisdom).
- According to Scripture he was wiser that anyone else in the Middle East.
- Kings of other countries sent constituents to learn of Solomon's great wisdom and teachings.
- Solomon's fame spread throughout the known world.
- Much of Solomon's wisdom was written down and preserved for future generations.
- Solomon wrote 3,000 proverbs; many recorded in the book of Proverbs.
- Solomon was credited with writing Song of Songs, Psalms 72 and 127. He is thought to have probably written the book of Ecclesiastes.
- The proverbs of Solomon were not written for Solomon's glory or a showcase for his wisdom. They were written for the reader (the listener) in:
 - ✓ Attaining wisdom and discipline (1:2)
 - ✓ Understanding words of insight (1:2)
 - \checkmark Acquiring a disciplined and prudent life (1:3)
 - \checkmark Doing what is right, just, and fair (1:3)
 - \checkmark Giving prudence to the simple (1:4)
 - \checkmark Knowledge and discretion to the young (1:4)
- He wrote so that God's people would think before acting and live better lives as an example for others.
- The word "wisdom" occurs 51 times in the book of Proverbs (main theme of book).
- "Wisdom" in Proverbs is used to include the concept of living skillfully according to God's plan....thus avoiding moral failings that stunt the spiritual growth of the children of God.
- Verse 7 of chapter 1 is pivotal in understanding the overarching theme..."The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge." Fearing God conveys the idea of reverence and submission to the lordship of God.
- True wisdom then is....when we honor god with our worship and submission to His will.
- Throughout most of Solomon's reign, he applied God's principles of wisdom in ruling the people of Israel. This resulted in peace and prosperity for the nation.
- When a nation faithfully follows God, that nation benefits under the protection of God....God's hand is faithfully on the willing and faithful heart.
